2nd Erasmus+ Student mobility

Akaki Regional Gymnasium, partner in the Erasmus+ “**Digital Powered Teaching**”, successfully organized the 2nd consecutive students’ mobility during the week of November 4-8, 2024.

Day 1

During the first day a short welcoming ceremony and two workshops were organised. Specifically, the digital tool **Quizlet** was presented and its use in a Language lesson, while an experiential workshop was held on the topic of “Unlocking the benefits of honey for our health: Nature’s golden medicine”. Afterwards, the students participated in a treasure hunt using the **Actionbound** application, with which they had the opportunity to walk around and get to know the village.

Day 2

Students travelled to Paphos and Limassol for an educational visit. There, the group was guided through archaeological sites, discovering the history of the island.



Day 3

The third day's program was dedicated to Health Education, with a visit to a local farm, where the students learned about the relationship between humans and the environment and organic agriculture. The next stop was the Medical School of the European University, where they had a tour at the University’s premises and a demonstration of the capabilities of the Sectra tool.

Day 4

The group visited the **Youth Makerspace** in Lamaca, where through the interactive workshop "Traveling in Our Body" they learned about the possibilities of new technologies, such as 3D pens and VR, while they closed the day with a visit to the Planetarium.



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Day 5

During the final day, the students visited the Troodos Geopark, which provided the group with beautiful images and rich knowledge about the natural environment of Cyprus and the need for its sustainable management. A farewell dinner followed, during which short videos of the students were presented, capturing the beautiful moments of the week, the spirit of cooperation and the educational nature of the mobility!
